Core components



Core Theory

Daily sessions on idea development, storytelling, narrative structure, audience engagement, persuasive techniques, and stage presence.



Practical Application

Collaborative small-group sessions focused on practical skills building: drafting, and refining each student's talk with helpful feedback.



1:1 Coaching

Personalised and group guidance on ideas, research, scriptwriting, delivery techniques, and visual design, tailored to each student's strengths and goals.

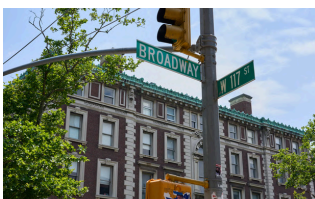

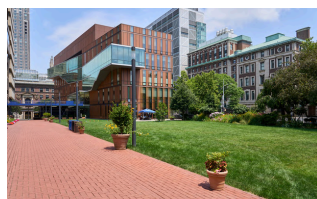

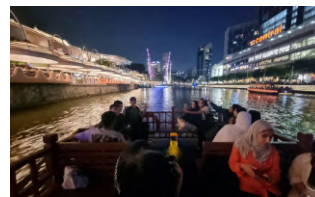

PROGRAMME STRUCTURE

Core components



Live Online Sessions

Two weeks of daily, live classes bring together small cohorts with a dedicated tutor for interactive, practice-focused learning. These sessions focus on crafting your very own TED-style talk. You'll learn by following a roadmap that includes idea sharing, peer and tutor feedback, discussion activities, refining structure and messaging, and delivery practice. These collaborative exercises help students strengthen their talk step by step.



Self-Paced Learning

Alongside their live classes, students use a bespoke TED platform for their daily independent learning. They watch videos and read curated materials, complete reflective tasks, explore research linked to their idea, draft and refine their script, and work through structured assignments at their own pace. Each task is designed to build the key skills needed to become a confident speaker and make steady progress on their TED-style talk.



Final Showcase

At the end of the programme, each student presents the TED-style talk they have prepared and refined throughout the course. Their talk is recorded and shared with them as part of their final portfolio.

Selection criteria

We are looking for students who bring:

- Diversity of ideas and perspectives
- Commitment to learning and collaboration
- A growth mindset and readiness to engage

We welcome students who are curious, motivated, and eager to grow as communicators, those with original ideas and open minds.

Eligibility

Applicants must be aged 15–18 at the start of their chosen session (or 14–18 for the virtual programme).

We recommend a minimum English level of B1–B2 (intermediate or higher) to ensure students can participate confidently in discussions and workshops

Frequently asked questions

Will talks be published online?

Students will receive a high-quality recording. Some talks may be shared on Immerse or TED channels.

How big are classes?

The programme is organised in small cohorts of about 7-8 students on average, allowing time for individual sessions and feedback.

Is this the same as a TED or TEDx conference?

No. This is a residential 2-week programme that is part of a partnership between Immerse Education and TED.

Do I need prior speaking experience?

No experience is required, just curiosity and enthusiasm. We believe everyone has an idea worth spreading, and we welcome students who are passionate about developing their speaking skills. Our model is tailored to each student's starting point.

What is the supervision model?

Residential programmes provide 24-hour pastoral care with trained staff, secure accommodation, and clear curfews.

What level of English is required?

We recommend students have a minimum English level of B2 to feel confident in discussions and presentations. If in doubt, include a short video sample with your enrolment.

Are there scholarships available?

We offer needs-based Financial Aid for the TED Summer School. This opportunity is open to students worldwide and ensures that every motivated learner can join the programme, regardless of financial background.
